This powerful tool is more commonly known to many of us by Science Citation Index, Social Sciences Citation Index and Arts and Humanities Citation Index. Now, we have access to all three at once and the ability to search them electronically.

This one-hour session will be at an introductory level for those who would like to learn how to use the database but don't want to be overloaded with fancy tricks.

Now the journals are no longer on the shelves to the west side of the floor. Both books and journals are on all shelves, filed by call number. Thus, if you're looking for a book and a journal that both have call numbers of RT1, then they should be physically located close to one another.

Integration of books and journals in the Q range are not yet completed. The entire fourth floor collection should be completely integrated sometime during the spring 2007 semester.
